Acknowledgement of the Responsibilities of Accepting the Permit

By accepting this permit, the permittee hereby agrees as follows:

1. It is in compliance with all permit requirements.
2. It is in compliance with all Ohio Motor Vehicle Laws and all Federal or State laws, rules, and regulations applicable to Commercial Motor Vehicles.
3. To hold harmless the State of Ohio / the permitting authority of a local jurisdiction / Integrity Permits LLC, its agents/employees, contractors and subcontractors from all suits, damages, or proceedings of any kind and to indemnify the State of Ohio, its agents/employees, contractors and subcontractors for any claim it may be required to pay arising from the movement of the goods.
4. To hold harmless the State of Ohio / the permitting authority of a local jurisdiction / Integrity Permits LLC, its agents/employees, contractors and subcontractors from all suits, damages, or proceedings of any kind arising from fraudulent use of user's login/password regarding escrow transactions or unauthorized requests for a hauling permit.
5. Integrity Permits LLC, its agents/employees, contractors and subcontractors cannot guarantee that every local authority will cooperate in the permitting process or will cooperate in a timely manner. In the event Integrity Permits LLC, its agents/employees, contractors and subcontractors are unable to acquire a legally requested Regional Heavy Haul Permit, documentation will be provided to show that reasonable and prudent steps were taken to acquire the requested permit in accordance with Ohio law.
NOTE: Permits acquisition fees will be applicable if a local jurisdiction fails to comply with its responsibility (Ohio Revised Code section 4513.34) to authorize or issue a legally requested hauling permit.
6. For an Overweight application, the vehicle configuration does meet minimum vehicle requirements to haul legal maximum weights (80000 pounds) as prescribed in ODOT document OS-8 (current version of OS-8 found at www.dot.state.oh.us/permits).
